EXODUS 1-34

1. God is present in silence, so I _____ Him Ex. 1-2

Genesis 46:2-4 God spoke to [Jacob]...”do not be afraid to go down to Egypt, for I will make you a great nation there. ⁴ I will go down with you to Egypt, and I will also surely bring you up again; and Joseph will close your eyes.”

Exodus 1:8, 11, 13 Now a new king arose over Egypt, who did not know Joseph....¹¹ They appointed taskmasters over them to afflict them with hard labor....¹³ The Egyptians compelled the sons of Israel to labor rigorously; ¹⁴ and they made their lives bitter with hard labor in mortar and bricks and at all kinds of labor in the field.

Exodus 5:2 Who is the Lord that I should obey His voice to let Israel go? I do not know the Lord.

Genesis 15:13-14 God said to Abram, “Know for certain that your descendants will be strangers in a land that is not theirs, where they will be enslaved and oppressed four hundred years. ¹⁴ But I will also judge the nation whom they will serve, and afterward they will come out with many possessions.”

Exodus 2:24 So God heard their groaning; and God remembered His covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.

Psalms 9:10 Those who know Your name will put their trust in You, for You, O Lord, have not forsaken those who seek You.

2. God uses the weak, so I _____ in Him Ex. 3-4

Exodus 3:10 Therefore, come now, and I will send you to Pharaoh, so that you may bring My people, the sons of Israel, out of Egypt.

Moses 3:11 Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh, and that I should bring the sons of Israel out of Egypt?

God 3:12 Certainly I will be with you.

Moses 3:13 Now they may say to me, “What is His name? What shall I say to them?”

God 3:14-15 I AM has sent me to you....¹⁵ This is My name forever, and this is My memorial-name to all generations.

Moses 4:1 What if they will not believe me or listen to what I say?

God 4:3 Throw [the staff] on the ground...⁷ Put your hand into your bosom...⁹ Take some water from the Nile.

Moses 4:10 Please, Lord, I have never been eloquent...for I am slow of speech and slow of tongue.

God 4:12 Now then go, and I, even I, will be with your mouth, and teach you what you are to say.

1 Corinthians 1:26-27, 31 For consider your calling, brethren, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble; ²⁷ but God has chosen the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong...³¹ so that, just as it is written, “Let him who boasts, boast in the Lord.”

2 Corinthians 4:7 But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, so that the surpassing greatness of the power will be of God and not from ourselves.

3. God reveals Himself, so I _____ Him

Exodus 6:2-3 God spoke further to Moses and said to him, “I am the Lord; and I appeared to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, as God Almighty, but by My name, Lord, I did not make Myself known to them.”

Exodus 15:11 Who is like You among the gods, O Lord? Who is like You, majestic in holiness, awesome in praises, working wonders?

Exodus 34:6-8 Then the Lord passed by in front of him and proclaimed, “The Lord, the Lord God, compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in lovingkindness and truth; ⁷ who keeps lovingkindness for thousands, who forgives iniquity, transgression and sin; yet He will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, visiting the iniquity of fathers on the children and on the grandchildren to the third and fourth generations.” ⁸ Moses made haste to bow low toward the earth and worship.

John 5:39 You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me.

4. God rescues His people, so I am _____ Ex 12-17

Exodus 7:5 The Egyptians shall know that I am the Lord, when I stretch out My hand on Egypt and bring out the sons of Israel from their midst.

Exodus 14:13-14 Moses said to the people, “Do not fear! Stand by and see the salvation of the Lord which He will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians whom you have seen today, you will never see them again forever. ¹⁴ The Lord will fight for you while you keep silent.”

Deuteronomy 7:7-8 The Lord did not set His love on you nor choose you because you were more in number than any of the peoples, for you were the fewest of all peoples, ⁸ but because the Lord loved you and kept the oath which He swore to your forefathers, the Lord brought you out by a mighty hand and redeemed you from the house of slavery, from the hand of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

John 8:34, 36 Jesus answered them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the slave of sin....³⁶ So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed.

Romans 6:17 But thanks be to God that though you were slaves of sin, you became obedient from the heart to that form of teaching to which you were committed.

5. God establishes His covenant, so I _____ Ex 19-24

Exodus 19:4-6 You yourselves have seen what I did to the Egyptians, and how I bore you on eagles’ wings, and brought you to Myself. ⁵ Now then, if you will indeed obey My voice and keep My covenant, then you shall be My own possession among all the peoples, for all the earth is Mine; ⁶ and you shall be to Me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation.

1 Peter 1:14-16 As obedient children, do not be conformed to the former lusts which were yours in your ignorance, ¹⁵ but like the Holy One who called you, be holy yourselves also in all your behavior; ¹⁶ because it is written, “You shall be holy, for I am holy.”

Jeremiah 31:31-34 Behold, days are coming,” declares the Lord, “when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah, ³² not like the covenant which I made with their fathers in the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, My covenant which they broke, although I was a husband to them,” declares the Lord. ³³ “But this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days,” declares the Lord, “I will put My law within them and on their heart I will write it; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people...for I will forgive their iniquity, and their sin I will remember no more.”

6. God dwells with His people, so I long for His _____ Ex 25-40

Exodus 29:45-46 I will dwell among the sons of Israel and will be their God. They shall know that I am the Lord their God who brought them out of the land of Egypt, that I might dwell among them; I am the Lord their God.

Revelation 21:3-5 And I heard a loud voice from the throne, saying, “Behold, the tabernacle of God is among men, and He will dwell among them, and they shall be His people, and God Himself will be among them, ⁴ and He will wipe away every tear from their eyes; and there will no longer be any death; there will no longer be any mourning, or crying, or pain; the first things have passed away.” ⁵ And He who sits on the throne said, “Behold, I am making all things new.” And He said, “Write, for these words are faithful and true.”
